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## *Weekly Announcements*

**Step Up and Do Your Part, July 12 and July 26, 2016** — Adult falls continue to be a leading cause of injury and death in Lee County. The numbers are staggering; one out of three seniors fall each year, 20 percent of those who fall are hospitalized, and 50 percent of those who are hospitalized pass away within a year. “Falls are both unintentional and preventable,” says Mark Tesoro, Injury Prevention Educator/Analyst for Trauma Services at Lee Memorial Health System. “Through education, risk assessment and free health care screenings, we continue to raise awareness of preventive measures that can keep seniors safe.” To help the community learn ways to help improve balance and prevent falls the Trauma Center and Chapel by the Sea are hosting a falls prevention health event that is free and open to the public and includes a “*Step WiseLee*” presentation on Tuesday, July 12 and a brief, individual balance screening on Tuesday, July 26. Both classes run from 2:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m. at Chapel campus in Silver Hall. *Please email the Chapel Office at [denise@chapelbts.org](mailto:denise@chapelbts.org) to register to attend as space is limited.* The “*Step WiseLee*” initiative began in Sept. 2009 to unite local health care agencies, residents, family and friends to collaborate in preventing falls and fall-related injuries and deaths in Lee County.
