Date Change, Step Up & Do Your Part, August 2, 2016 (*originally scheduled on July 26*) — Individual Balance Screening from 2:00 – 4:00 p.m. in Silver Hall. This is part of the *Step WiseLee* Fall Prevention Program hosted by the Lee Memorial Trauma Center and Chapel. Reservations are needed for individual time slots. For a specific appointment, please contact the office at (239) 463-3173 ext. 20. Adult falls continue to be a leading cause of injury and death in Lee County. The numbers are staggering; one out of three seniors fall each year, 20 percent of those who fall are hospitalized, and 50 percent of those who are hospitalized pass away within a year. *“Falls are both unintentional and preventable,”* says Mark Tesoro, Injury Prevention Educator/Analyst for Trauma Services at Lee Memorial Health System. *“Through education, risk assessment and free health care screenings, we continue to raise awareness of preventive measures that can keep seniors safe.”* The *“Step WiseLee”* initiative began in Sept. 2009 to unite local health care agencies, residents, family and friends to collaborate in preventing falls and fall-related injuries and deaths in Lee County. The Palm Tree Window at Chapel



In II Chronicles 3:5 and I Kings 7:36 we read that the doors of the Temple were decorated with a palm tree motif. In the New Testament, Jesus was greeted as he entered Jerusalem by people waving branches from the trees, and the liturgical calendar celebrates that day on Palm Sunday. The palm has become a symbol of victory. The palm tree window is also a reminder of our island community with its abundance of palm trees. The Palm Tree Window was given by Isabel A. Stanley in memory of her husband Willard C. Stanley and her son, Craig B. Stanley.
