Elena's Story

My home was a part of the former Soviet Union. My sister and I were often neglected by our parents, and were left to fend for ourselves, without food. Until we were placed in an orphanage when I was 8 years old, we did not attend school. We did not know our birth dates or how old we were. I would always read fairy tales to get away from reality and dreamed of being Cinderella because she went from being a nobody to being a princess.

I had gotten my hopes up when my sister and I were being considered for adoption, but at the last minute the woman backed out. I felt undeserving because I thought I was a nobody. At my lowest point of feeling worthless, God brought me a shoebox! It was suitable for a princess. It was pink and one of my gifts was a pink pin with a dangling heart. I also received a teddy bear. What had the greatest impact was "The Greatest Gift" booklet that told about the love of Jesus. I had never heard about that kind of love before.

I began to pray for a family and God provided us with a family when I was 12. We were told that we were loved. We had never heard that before. A year after we were adopted, I became a Christian. Our parents told us that "God loves you, we love you, and there is nothing you can do to change that".

Much later while studying at Ozark Christian College, I helped organize shoebox packing parties so other children would learn of God's love for them. I look forward to continuing to share His love with orphans around the world.

God’s Table — In need of men’s underwear (small, and medium sizes) and white socks.



The Grapevine Window at Chapel
