Bringing Joy to the Ends of the Earth Nanor and a Doll

God planted a seed of faith in my heart when I received my shoebox. I received my shoebox in the Middle East at the age of 8. I'll never forget that day and remember every gift in it. I kept the box to this day. It was so lovely. The box was beautifully wrapped in green paper that had little children on it - opening gifts by a Christmas tree. The most exciting gifts were a Barbie Doll and a stationery kit. I loved Barbies – and then I got a real one! I felt I must be really special to have my own stationery kit. It had a notebook, five different colored markers, a stamp, a glittery sticker sheet, and a pink pen. It was so special that I didn't want to use it. I've only used about four or five of the fifty stickers and one notebook sheet. Almost everything in the kit is still intact. One thing in the box that I'll never forget was a picture and letter of a girl from Ohio. We started writing letters and nearly 20 years later we're still friends.

When I moved to America, I realized how much tension there is between the Middle East and the United States. That shoebox was a seed of friendship planted many years ago. Even though we lived in different parts of the world, my pen pal and I had the unity of Christ when our countries had disagreements. The box is a sign of peace in a time of war.

The spiritual part is the most important part of the gifts. A year after I received my box I received Jesus. Only when I got to the United States and was sending a box myself did I get what happened. It all hit me as I got to know God more and the journey He had brought me through. I realized that I received something very special at that time.

I also realized how much care had gone into preparing the shoeboxes, especially the prayer and love that had been put into the box. The shoebox gave me an extreme amount of happiness. I could see the importance of using the box as a tool to show God's love.
