

Also, you may not know that there are health benefits to donating...you will receive a mini-physical at no cost, which includes checking your vital signs, hemoglobin and cholesterol levels and you will be told your blood type. To donate blood you must: weigh at least 115 lbs., be at least 17 years old, be in general good health - no colds, flu sore throat, etc., present a photo I.D. with D.O.B., if a new donor. Reformation Sunday, October 28 — During Sunday worship, we will recognize our Scottish Heritage of the Presbyterian denomination known as "*The Kirkin' O' the Tartan.*" As part of the celebration, James Freeman will share his artistry of bagpiping and accompany our Music Director, Michael Melnikov. Pastor Steve will join in on snare drum. Following worship, we will gather in Silver Hall for coffee hour to partake of some traditional Scottish desserts. Feel free to wear your family colors or kilt and/or bring a dessert reflecting memories of your Scottish roots. The *Kirkin' O' the Tartan* is a celebration of Presbyterian roots, going back to the Protestant Reformation of the 16th century. At that time, Scottish people expressed their family heritage by wearing a specific plaid cloth known as a clan tartan.

Food Week of Action and World Food Day, October 14 – 21 — The Presbyterian Hunger Program envisions a world where everyone has enough affordable, healthy and culturally appropriate food, where no one is hungry, and where all who work in the food chain are fairly compensated, respected and celebrated. The purpose of the Food Week of Action is to raise awareness about hunger and its underlying causes, and to motivate people to take one or more actions of local and national concerns. There is a great need across the globe for more equitable and ecological food and farm systems, which will bring communities close to food sovereignty, and more control over seeds and land. Operation Christmas Child, Marina's Story — Marina lost her mother to TB when she was just 5 years old. With no one to take care of her and her brother, they were placed in a government run orphanage, a cold uncaring place which left Marina feeling forgotten and unwanted. Then she received a shoebox. In it were toys, school supplies and Stickers! There were gifts especially meant for her. She did not have to share them. Those gifts gave her Hope and the knowledge that there was Kindness and Love out there. All because of a simple shoebox. At the age of 10, she and her brother were adopted. Their family taught them about the love of God and Jesus. That family packed shoeboxes which reminded her of the one she had received long ago. Now she packs shoeboxes because she wants children around the world to feel the love of God and to feel wanted. She thanks all of you who pack shoeboxes!
