Reformation Sunday, Today!

During Worship today we will recognize our Scottish Heritage of the Presbyterian denomination known as “*The Kirkin’ O’ the Tartan.*” As part of the celebration, James Freeman will share his artistry of bagpiping and accompany our Music Director, Michael Melnikov. Following worship, we will gather in Silver Hall for coffee hour to partake of some traditional Scottish desserts.

The *Kirkin’ O’ the Tartan* is a celebration of Presbyterian roots, going back to the Protestant Reformation of the 16th century. At that time, Scottish people expressed their family heritage by wearing a specific plaid cloth known as a clan tartan.
